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1. General Information:

- A. The NAO Baseball/Softball Board is made up of all volunteers who were appointed to the Baseball Board by the VP of Youth and approved by the NAO Board of Directors. The duties of the NAO Baseball/Softball Board are as follows:

NAO Club President An ex-officio member of all Optimist Boards and/or committees. Does not have voting authority on the Baseball/Softball Board.

VP of Youth An ex-officio member of all Youth Boards and/or committees. Carries out such duties and assignments as maybe delegated to him/her by the Baseball/Softball Board President. Does not have voting authority on the Baseball/Softball Board. Over sees the operations of the Baseball Board.

Baseball President Presides at all Baseball/Softball board meetings. Supervises the functions of the various committees, and sees that the rules, policies, and principles of North Austin Optimist and PONY Baseball are carried out. Only has voting authority in case of a tie.

Secretary	Records the minutes of board meetings and handles league correspondence.
Player Agent	Maintain a balance of strength among the teams of the league. Must consistently remind everyone connected with the program that the welfare of the players and the league are paramount rather than a single manager or team. The player agent arranges for and supervises all tryout sessions. He/She shall supervise the distribution of players among teams and shall maintain the player pool during the regular and the All-star season.
Treasurer	Responsible for the collection and disbursement of league funds. Keeps financial records, compiles reports on those records and prepares the league budget with the assistance of the Baseball Board
Registrar	Conducts the registration of all players and coaches. Responsible for collecting all league fees of players/coaches with the help of the Division Commissioners
Commissioners	Over sees their assigned division. Works closely with the Player Agent to make sure that the players are fairly assigned to teams. Assists in all tryout sessions. Works with coaches and parents of their division to resolve any disputes that may occur. Consults with Baseball President in case disputes need to be escalated. Responsible for the general preparation, maintenance, development and improvement of all baseball/softball fields. Makes recommendations to the Baseball Board for suggested or needed expenditures for field improvements.
Athletic Equipment Manager	Responsible for the inventory, purchasing, maintaining and issuing of baseball equipment. Also responsible for the collection of equipment at the end of the season and storage during the off-season.
Field Equipment	Responsible for the inventory, purchasing, and maintaining of all field maintenance equipment. Responsible for the storage and purchase of gasoline of such equipment.
Head Team Rep.	Relays all league information from the Baseball Board to the individual team representatives. With the help of the Board, organizes opening day carnival, opening ceremonies, picture day, and closing ceremonies. Responsible for supervising all fundraising activity for the league. Collects all funds related to fundraising
Sponsors&Trophies	Responsible for supervising all sponsorship activity for the league which includes securing the sponsors on behalf of each team. Collects all funds related to sponsorship. Also purchases trophies for all players as well as team trophies for tournaments.
Umpire-in-Chief	Responsible for obtaining suitable umpires for the league. Receives all complaints relative to umpires and makes suitable recommendations to the Baseball Board. Shall make every effort to register all umpires with PONY Baseball. Will submit to the Treasurer weekly a summary for umpire's payroll.
Fundraising	Coordinates all fundraising activities at NAO baseball/softball games and events.
Uniforms	Coordinates the purchase of all team jerseys and hats for players, as well as t-shirts for parents and family members.
Schedulers	Work with other leagues in Central Texas to schedule games for all NAO teams. Also serve as tournament coordinators prior to and during NAO-hosted tournaments.

- B. All problems or issues concerning your team or division must be addressed to your division's commissioner. A coach may petition the Baseball President and V.P. of Youth Activities and then the NAO Baseball Board, of the concerns or complaints only if attention still warrants. Complaints and concerns should be in writing and must be given to your division's commissioner. Any petition that has not gone through the appropriate commissioner will be rejected.
- C. If the NAO Baseball Board rules on a matter, the VP of Youth, Baseball President, and Player Agent

must all agree in order for the matter to be brought back before the board.

- D. The Official playing rules shall be “Official Rules Major League Baseball”, except for exceptions and variations contained in the “PONY Baseball 2012 Baseball and Girls Softball Rules and Regulations”, NAO House Rules, and the GAACPL Rules.
- E. North Austin Optimist will play the 2012 Season under the Traditional PONY Baseball age brackets for Baseball. Shetland players will be age 4, 5 & 6 (except as noted in F.), Pinto players will be age 7 & 8 (except as noted in G.), Mustang players will be age 9 & 10, Bronco players will be age 11 & 12, Pony players will be age 13 & 14. Colt & Palomino player ages will be in accordance with the mix of the best interest of the team at the time it is formed.
- F. Four year olds will be allowed to play in the Shetland division if their parent, other family member, or close family friend also volunteers to be a coach for that team.
- G. The NAO Baseball Board will consider, on a case-by-case basis, allowing six year olds to play “up” in the Pinto division. This will only be done if it is in the best interest of the child and in consultation with the child’s parents and coaches. Any child who does play “up” will not be eligible to play for any NAO All-Star team.
- H. North Austin Optimist will play the 2012 Season using the “And Under” PONY age brackets for Softball. Pinto players will be age 8 and under, Mustang players will be age 10 and under, Bronco players will age 12 and under, and Pony players will be age 16 and under. Please see Section 6 for more information regarding softball team selection.
- I. For the Fall 2012 Baseball Season, players will be assigned divisions based on their 2013 age eligibility. However, the NAO Baseball Board will consider, on a case by case basis, placing some players based on their 2012 age if it is in the best interest of the child to receive additional instruction at the lower division. This will only be done in consultation with the child’s parents and coaches.
- J. Per the PONY Baseball rules for 2012, no bat in any division shall exceed a diameter of 2 5/8”. Any bat that exceeds this limit will be removed from play immediately. If the bat is discovered after a game has started, the coach for that team will be ejected. Please see L(1) for more information regarding coach ejections.
- K. The North Austin Optimist and N.A.O. name and or logo cannot be duplicated or used without prior Board approval.
- L. Definitions of penalties:
 - 1. Coach’s Ejection Penalty: Any coach who is ejected from a game at either our fields or while visiting another field, will be suspended for two games, the initial game from which ejected and the following game. The ejected coach will not have contact with their team of any kind during the games from which suspended. Also the coach will go before the NAO Baseball Board for a review of the violation.
 - 2. Player’s Ejection Penalty: Any player who is ejected from a game at either our fields or while visiting another field, will be suspended for two games, the initial game from which ejected and the following game.
 - 3. Suspended Coach/Player: Will not have contact with their team of any kind during games. Any coach doing so will be dismissed for the remaining season.
 - 4. Dismissed Coach: Will have no coaching responsibilities whatsoever.

- I. The Baseball Board shall have the authority to suspend, discharge, or otherwise discipline any player, manager, coach, umpire, league officer or other person whose conduct is in violation of the Rules and Regulation of PONY Baseball and North Austin Optimist and/or is considered detrimental to the best interests of the league.
 1. Persons subject to such discipline shall have the right to a hearing before the Baseball Board before such discipline is imposed.
 2. In the event of such a hearing involving a player, or other person under the age of 18, that person's parents shall be invited to attend.

2. Coach's Application Process:

- A. All potential head and/or assistant coaches must be at least 18 years of age and complete an N.A.O. coach's applications. Incomplete applications will not be considered. All coach's \$10.00 application fee must be paid by opening day.
- B. The current baseball board will review and either approve or deny the applications. Applicants can be denied for any reason that is in the best interest of the organization.
- C. Once the application has been approved, the Optimist Club of North Austin, to ensure that potential coaches meet basic established guidelines, will perform a criminal history background check. Anyone not meeting the basic guidelines will not be approved. The baseball President will relay the ineligibility to the applicant.
- D. The determination of NAO head coaches will be done first by NAO Board secret-ballot vote. The discussion by the Board regarding each coaching applicant will center on the following traits:
 - 1) Dedication
 - 2) Communication
 - 3) Experience/Knowledge
- E. If there is a tie upon counting the ballots, the Board will revote on tied coaches only to determine the head coach.
- F. In the event that there are more teams than coach's applications, parents and/or relatives may be asked to volunteer and coach a team but must go through the same process as all coaches do as laid out above.

3. Coach/Player Conduct:

- A. Swearing and abusive language is strictly prohibited.
- B. Use of tobacco, illegal drugs or alcohol during games or practices, on or off the field is strictly forbidden. .
- C. No enticements will be given to a player by any coach to play for their team!
- D. Heated discussions or arguments by the coaches on the playing or practice field will not be tolerated.
- E. No soft toss against fences. Whiffle balls are ok.
- F. Umpire judgment calls (Balls, Strikes, Fair, Foul, Out, Safe) will not be argued.

4. Coach Responsibilities:

- A. It is the head coach's responsibility to establish whom their assistant coaches will be on or before February 11, 2012 in order to protect that coach's child as a protected player. If an assistant coach has not been named on or before February 11, 2012 that child must go through the tryouts and draft as any other player would.
- B. If you do not have a child in the division in which you are coaching, you can protect (one) relative or

child/children of a significant other not living with you.

- C. The Shetland's, Pinto's and Softball's staff will consist of four coaches, one team representative and one scorekeeper. The Mustang's through Palomino staff will consist of three coaches, one team representative and one scorekeeper.
- D. Once the assistant coaches have been established no coaching personnel changes can be made without prior NAO Baseball Board approval.
- E. Only the head and assistant coaches may be in the dugouts or on the playing field during scheduled games. In the event that a coach is absent only the scorekeeper or team representative may substitute for the absent coach.
- F. Only the head coach or an appointed assistant coach may act on behalf of the team during games.
- G. No rulebooks will be allowed to be carried onto the playing field during a game. The rulebook will only be allowed in the dugout.
- H. All coaches are required to attend the NAO coaches meeting, where they will be given information on the 2012 Baseball Season. All the house rules will be covered word for word. All Head coaches must sign and date the back sheet which verifies that they have read, understand and agree to comply with said rules. Any Head Coach refusing to sign the agreement will have to appear before the Baseball Board. This will prevent the "I didn't know" excuse for violating a rule.
- I. Head coaches must attend all meetings called by their Division's Commissioner and/or Baseball President. Because of their importance, if the head coach is unable to attend then an assistant coach from that team must attend in place of the head coach. Failure to have a coach at the meeting(s) will result in a one game suspension of the violating team's head coach.
- J. The head coach must notify their Commissioner and/or a NAO Baseball Board member of any injuries to players, which requires medical attention, while playing or practicing baseball for N.A.O., within one (1) day / (24 hours) of said injury. Any coach failing to do so will have to appear before the Baseball Board. This rule is for insurance purposes which could possibly lead to lawsuits.
- K. The NAO Baseball Board does not allow coaches or team representatives to accept contributions of any kind (monetary, uniforms or equipment) for any regular season team or organization without prior approval. The NAO Baseball Board must approve and record any and all contributions made to the team or organization. The head coach of the violating team will be suspended pending review by the NAO Baseball Board. All-Star teams are allowed to hold fund-raisers or accept contributions, to be used specifically for their all-star team of that same year. Any all-star funds or contributions raised in this manner must be submitted to the NAO Baseball Board. The Board will reimburse the team up to the dollar amount raised. All expenses must be team related, equally distributed among all the players, and a receipt must be submitted for reimbursement. Any unused monies will be donated to the Baseball fund.
- L. All teams must get permission from only their respective Commissioner prior to practicing or scrimmaging on the NAO Baseball and football fields. No practices will be allowed on any NAO field until the entire complex is ready for Opening Day. Coaches who do not participate in field maintenance and preparation do not qualify for any practice time on NAO fields.
- M. An initial practice schedule for the NAO field practice times will be assigned at the Coach's meeting. Any changes to that initial schedule must be approved by that particular divisions Commissioner(s).

- N. Head coaches will sign for and be responsible for returning all issued NAO equipment. The head coach or an assistant coach of each team is required to submit a \$100.00 deposit when they pick up their equipment prior to the beginning of practice.
- O. Teams may meet for practices and/or games up to 4 days but not more than 7 hours per week.
- P. No practice is allowed in the complex during any tournaments when NAO is hosting.

5. Coaching Positions:

- A. If the head coach of a team either does not return or moves up to another division, an assistant coach may not return as head coach of that team within the same division the following year.
- B. A returning head coach returning as head coach to the same team in the same division may protect (7) of their returning players from their previous Spring season.
- C. Shetland coaches will be able to protect (8) players on their team. The players do not have to be returning players and can be requests from parents/guardians.
- D. A returning head coach returning as head coach for the same team to the same division may choose to disband the team, thus releasing all of his returning players back to the player draft and start with a fresh draft. The only exception is that he may retain his same assistant coaches from the prior year and their children.
- E. A head coach moving from division “A” to head coach in division “B” may not protect any returning players to the team in division “B” nor from their previous team in division “A” except for their children and those of their assistants.

6. Player Tryouts/Drafts:

- A. Player eligibility for special needs will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
- B. Any player changing to a division must go through the tryouts and player draft. If a player does not go through the tryouts he/she will be placed on a team via the draft rotation.
- C. All players must tryout and enter the player draft, except for registered protected players. (A registered protected player is a returning team member to the same division named by a returning coach or a coach’s child that has registered on or before February 11th.) NOTE: Shetland players are excluded from this rule, they do not try out.
- D. All players must be registered on or before February 11, 2012 in order to tryout. ANY player registering after February 11, 2012 must go into the player draft rotation, this includes any returning players to a team within the same division.
- E. Players needing to ride together may be linked in the draft as long as all of the players involved participate in the player tryouts and draft or draft rotation.
- F. No ride rule will be permitted in conjunction with a protected player. (Note: Coaches are encouraged to trade per rule “6-J” to help ride problems.)
- G. No player can be placed on a team by a coach, only the Player Agent may do so.

- H. Tryouts will be held on Saturday, February 18, 2012. All eligible players will need to attend the tryouts and each player will be asked to perform the same baseball and/or softball tasks, which will be determined by the NAO Baseball Board. Registered protected players will be excluded from the tryouts and draft.
- I. The Baseball President, Division Commissioner, and Player Agent must be present at all drafts (regular season and all-stars) for their divisions. If the Baseball President is unable to attend the draft then an appropriate substitute appointed by the Baseball President will act as commissioner for that draft. The appointed commissioner will have no relatives or have an active interest in that division.
- J. Upon the conclusion of tryouts only the head coach from each team in each division will be allowed to attend the player draft for that division. If a head coach is unable to attend the player draft, an assistant coach may select players for that team instead. If no coaches from a team attend the draft, the Baseball President or Commissioner for that division will represent the absent team. If this occurs there will be no arguments from the absent coach about the players selected. If a head coach does not like the team selected, that coach may resign his position and let one of the assistant coaches take the team.
- K. Each head coach will draw a number to determine the order of draft picks. If a team already has players on the roster, due to protected players, the team with the fewest players will pick first and will keep picking until that team is equal in number of players, and then the draft pick rotation will be enforced.
- L. The draft rotation will be done as follows: The 'Player Agent will shuffle all of the remaining registration forms and then place the players on the next team in the order of rotation
- M. Only the Player Agent and Baseball President will be allowed to know the order of rotation and shall not divulge that information to anyone.
- N. Head Coaches may trade players once the player draft is complete, but will not be official until the Player Agent has been notified and assures that the trade has been agreed upon by both coaches involved. No trades will be made once the draft meeting is concluded for the day.
- O. Team size will be limited to thirteen players per team maximum for Pinto through Colt and fourteen players per team maximum for Shetland and Softball.
- P. The number of teams will be decided by the number of registered players in each division by ten (10) after the last day of regular registration has been completed but before the day of the drafts. After which, late registrations will be accepted in each division until the teams in each division reach their maximums.
- Q. Any team holding practice prior to the player draft will forfeit all protected players and those players will be placed on the draft rotation.
- R. No registered player is permitted to practice with any team until assigned to a team by their Division Commissioner. If so, he/she is automatically not allowed to play on that team.
- S. The NAO Baseball Board will select all-star head coaches for each division. Coaches that have no interest in being considered for All-Stars must inform the Baseball President at their respective draft.
- T. If an All-Star coach quits after teams have been selected, the NAO Baseball Board will select a replacement from the pool of eligible regular season coaches.

6. Schedules/Games:

- A. NAO field practice schedules will be scheduled at the Coaches meeting. Changes to the schedule must be approved by the respective Commissioners involved with that particular field.
- B. No practices on NAO fields will be scheduled until the entire complex is deemed ready by the Baseball Board President or Baseball Board for Opening Day and until proof of insurance has been acquired.
- C. No team will be allowed to play any team not on their regular season schedule without prior NAO Baseball Board approval.
- D. No one except for players, coaches, and umpires will be allowed on the field or in the dugouts during games.
- E. The V.P. of Youth, Baseball President, an appointed Commissioner by the President, or the Head Umpire may declare the playing field unsuitable for play due to weather conditions. Cancellation of games due to weather should be decided by 5:15 p.m. that day.
- F. Head coaches and parents may call the NAO clubhouse at 451-8355 to see if a game has been rained out prior to coming to the field. The answering machine will be updated with rainout status of games as soon as possible.
- G. All rainouts will be played at the earliest date available as provided by the appointed game scheduler. Your division commissioner will notify you of your rescheduled date and time. If it rains again on the rescheduled date/time, the game will be considered a tie.
- H. Coaches CANNOT set their own games schedules. Failure to play a scheduled game will result in a forfeit.
- I. The game time limits are as follows:

Shetland:	60 minutes	Bronco:	1 hr & 50minutes
Pinto:	75 minutes	Pony:	1 hr & 50minutes
Mustang:	90 minutes	Colt:	1 hr & 50minutes

Softball:	Pinto: 60 minutes	Mustang thru Pony: 1 hr & 15 minutes	
- J. The plate umpire will be the official timekeeper.
- K. Shetland through Bronco divisions will have a five run or three outs rule for the first five innings. The sixth inning of Shetland through Bronco will have a ten-run inning. The seventh inning will be open.
- L. No new inning will start after time expires. A new inning starts after last out is made.
- M. There will be free substitutions for Shetland through Pony. It is the Head Coach's responsibility to ensure that all their players (Shetland-Mustang) must play every other inning during each game (pre-, regular or post-season play "excluding all-stars). Bronco and Pony plays at least two innings. Once an inning starts there will be no substitutions unless a player is hurt. Shetland through Pony divisions must bat the entire roster. You may choose to change your batting lineup for every game. You cannot change your lineup during a game. .
- N. In Shetland through Pony divisions, all players will bat in rotation during the game. The rotation will remain the same throughout the game. Late arrivals will be placed at the end of the batting rotation. Once the entire line up has batted and the first batter in the line up has batted twice, no players can be added to the batting list, unless agreed with other coach.
- O. During regular season play a team may play a game with one player short of a full defense. Shetland teams are required to field a minimum of nine players on defense; the tenth batting position will be an automatic

out. Pinto, Mustang and Bronco teams are required to field a minimum of eight players on defense, the ninth batting position will be an automatic out.

- Q. Each team must have a scorekeeper. The home team will be the official scorekeeper. No score or standings are to be kept in Shetland. After the game, both head coaches will sign the official scorecard kept by the head umpire.
- R. Protesting a game: The protesting head coach will announce to the umpire when a game is being played under protest. Scorekeepers must make a note of the protest in the scorebook exactly when it occurs. **IMPORTANT:** "Rules Protests" must be in writing and include the rule that applies. If the rule in question cannot be found, the protest will not stand. Written protests must be given to the Division Commissioner **WITHIN 24 HOURS** of the onset of the game in question. There are **NO** protests on umpire "judgment calls".
- S. If there are multiple leagues involved in division play, only regular season games played against other NAO teams will count toward determining the division champion.
- T. In case of a tie at the end of the season, there will be a one- (1) game play-off to determine the division champion. That game will go extra innings as needed to determine the champion.
- U. In Mustang, no suicide steal and squeeze to home plate will be allowed.
- V. Curve balls are to be discouraged in Mustang.

7. Team Equipment:

- A. Team or organizational equipment will be purchased by the equipment manager.
- B. All playing equipment must be PONY Baseball/Softball approved.
- C. Notify the equipment manager immediately of any equipment problems or needs.
- D. Head coaches will be responsible for signing out, the care of and returning any and all team issued equipment to the Equipment Manager prior to Closing Ceremonies at NAO.
- E. Foreign objects such as stars, medals, stickers, etc., are not allowed on any N.A.O. uniform or team equipment.
- F. All players and coaches must be in uniform to be on the playing field or in the dugouts. (Uniform entails league shirt and cap.)
- G. All teams must wear league issued uniforms during regular and post-season play.
- H. Only Pony, Colt and Bronco players are allowed to wear metal cleats. Shetland through Mustang players must wear rubber cleats.

8. Team Duties:

- A. Each head coach will choose a Team Representative who will be responsible for attending all Team Representative meeting's and relaying any messages from the NAO Baseball Board to their team's coaches and parents. Such as Concession Stand and Field Duty dates, picture dates, fund raising information, Opening and Closing Ceremony information, etc. Coaches please choose your team rep. wisely; make sure that they

will keep you informed of upcoming events. The NAO Baseball Board will not accept “My team rep. didn’t tell me.” as an excuse for missing a team assigned duty.

- B. Each team will be assigned to ‘Concession Stand Duty’ throughout the season. All team coaches and parents must sign-in at the concession stand when they report for the assigned team duties in order to be credited for their participation. If a team consisting of a minimum of 4 parents does not work on their assigned concession day for the duration of the shift the head coach for that team will be suspended from the following game and the team will be suspended from practicing on NAO fields pending NAO Baseball board review. Remind the parents that they agreed to participate in the team’s assigned duties when they signed their child’s registration form. Parent participation is expected. Your team will be notified at least one week prior to their assigned Concession Stand Duty date.
- C Each team will be assigned to ‘Field Duty’ throughout the season. If a team does not work on their assigned field duty the head coach for that team will be suspended from the following game and the team will be suspended from practicing on NAO fields pending NAO Baseball board review. Remind the parents that they agreed to participate in the team’s assigned duties when they signed their child’s registration form. Parent participation is expected. Your team will be notified at least one week prior to their assigned Field Duty date. Field Duty includes picking up trash, emptying all trash barrels into the dumpster, cutting, weed eating the grass, and cleaning the bathrooms.
- D. On game day, the home team of the first game is responsible for preparing the field at least fifteen minutes prior to the scheduled game time. (Responsibilities include: chalking the field, placing the bases, raking and watering the playing areas as needed, connect scoreboard controls.) Both teams of the last game of the day will return the bases and scoreboard controls to the designated areas. Both teams will also water and rake the infield after the game.
- E. All NAO players must pick up trash in the dugouts and around the bleachers after each game and/or practice before leaving the field, no matter if it is at our fields or any other field
- F. Each team is responsible for appointing an adult to work in the concession after each of your games at NAO to dispense team drinks to your players.
